- Enforces thinking of learning in terms of “management” and “systems.”
- Silos off learning from other areas of the department, faculty, university, discipline, world, future.
- Pushes students into virtual environments that don’t teach them anything about digital literacy.
- Costs a lot of money (some worse than others).
- Doesn’t inspire passion, excitement, interest.
